This presentation offers two complementary perspectives on the value-added of patents and the related significance of intangible asset valuation to the modern enterprise. Dr Jongsay Yong will discuss the findings from a recent survey of almost 1,500 Australian inventions which collects information regarding the commercialisation process of Australian inventions, including the monetary value generated. Dr Robert B Sanders will offer a practitioner's perspective by outlining how such intangible asset contributions to enterprise value can be understood in the context of an improving, international, approach to intangible asset valuation itself. Overall, the presentation will offer attendees both a theoretical, and practical, perspective on the issue of enterprise intangible asset treatment and valuation.



Dr Jongsay Yong is a Senior Research Fellow at the Melbourne Institute of Applied Economic & Social Research, University of Melbourne. He joined the Institute in 2002, after spending several years as lecturer and later senior lecturer at the National University of Singapore. His research interests are primarily in applied areas of industrial economics and health economics. In recent years he has been using micro data to investigate firm performance, productivity and innovation.

Dr Robert B Sanders is Managing Partner at Global IP Services LLP in Singapore. He is an experienced IP practitioner with more than 10 years of legal and commercial experience. He was awarded an IP Academy (Singapore) scholarship to undertake his PhD research at the National University of Singapore and was a recipient of a Presidents Graduate Fellowship. Robert was the co-author of a major research project Intangible Asset Valuation: Threats and Opportunities for Singaporean Businesses, commissioned by the IP Academy (Singapore).
